Spring has arrived and that indicates that our BPW year is winding down. Everything has moved so fast since I was installed last June. With the theme of "Strengthening the SOUL of BPW/ LA", the Executive Committee and I jumped right into the duties at hand. As reported in the Fall Pelican, 14 of us attended the National Conference in Dallas, where Louisiana won the "Giraffe Award" for "sticking our neck out" for Equal Pay, Past State President Angie Jackson Wilson was chosen National Membership Chair and Past State President Camille Moran was selected for membership on the National Legislative Committee.

In August, BPW/LA and the LA Coalition for ERA sponsored Women's Equality Day in Baton Rouge and the program was excellent - Another plus for our federation. In October, many of

the locals held National Business Women's Week celebrations. The congressional debate held in Monroe and sponsored by Monroe/West Monroe BPW was a real highlight. Four candidates squared off, including one woman, and a lively discussion followed. A banquet hosted by St. Bernard Parish BPW chose Man and Woman of the Year in St. Bernard for both 2005 and 2006 and over 200 people attended at the High School in the middle of all the Katrina devestation. West St. Tammany BPW held a banquet and raised over \$10,000.00 for their scholarship program. They also provided a team of workers to work on building a house for Habitat for Humanity. Many of the locals received proclamations from city and parish officials.

Two successful district meetings were held in the fall and my thanks go to the District Directors, Bonnie Cook, S. E. District and Delia Flynn, SW/Central District for informative and interesting speakers and good meetings.

January 26/27, 2007 was our Mid-Year Board and Legislative Day. Corvette Kowlaski, PE and Legislation Chair presented a very informative program and if you missed it, you missed something. We covered a lot of topics from Wage Club, Equal Pay, ERA, Heart Healthy Act, Retirement and Healthy Families to what we can do to help get legislation passed on these important issues. Members of the AAUW attended as well as our members.

Thanks to all of you who attended Mid Year Board. Our group was small, about 31, but mighty. Everything went very well and lots of business was conducted.

Delia, Cory, Camille, Angie and I attended Policy and Action in Washington, DC in February and learned so much. As I stated in my Soul Mates Today newsletter recently, thank you for allowing us this opportunity to speak for Louisiana on the issues. We also showed our Equal Pay PSA DVD and that gave Louisiana more exposure at the National level.

In March, two more very successful District meetings were held including elections for the coming year. S. E. District's new Director will be Cynthia Thompson, currently West St. Tammany President. Congratulations Cynthia. SW/Central District's new Director will be Linda Burns, Past State President. Much success to you Linda.

As we prepare for Equal Pay Day in a few weeks, be aware that the real work of passing the Equal



Pay for Women Act in Louisiana should be going on right now. Camille Moran, ERA/Equal Pay Coordinator and I are asking you to visit your legislators in their district offices and ask for support for the Equal Pay for Women Act. We need more sponsors. Rep. Willie Hunter, Monroe is introducing the bill once more and he has asked for our help before it comes up. He needs co-sponsors. How you as BPW members can help is to make those visits, phone calls, e-mails, anything to get the support of at least 60 legislators in the house before the session even starts on April 30, 2007. Rep. Hunter is on term limits so this is his last time to pursue this important issue. Let's help him. After you have completed your visits or phone calls, call or e-mail Camille and let her know what happened. Be sure and ask for co-sponsorship, but if not that, than ask for their vote (yes) when it comes up. She will let Rep. Hunter know what is happening with the sponsorships. He has said he will alter some of the wording of the bill that hopefully will make it more



agreeable to passage.

This will all come up in mid May at the Labor Relations Board Meeting in Baton Rouge. Plan now to attend as Camille, Cory, and I testify at the meeting. We need people there to show support. The Lobbyist groups will be there and we need to show we are strong.

As I call you to state conference, I am proud of what we have accomplished this year. It's taking longer than everyone thought to recover from 2005 and the hurricanes. We truly are "Strengthening the SOUL of BPW/LA". Only YOU can make our federation what is was before and as we go on, it will get nothing but better. Build your membership, offer interesting programs and educational opportunities for your members. Strength, Opportunity, Unity, & Leadership, (SOUL) is what we have to continue to improve, keeping the history and why we began in the first place and looking to a new future that will only be good for BPW/LA.

Thank you for allowing me to serve you, and see you in Natchitoches on June 7-10 for our state conference.

WOMEN HELPING WOMEN!

Wage Project & Clubs

Discrimination in wages is still a fact of life. Until we pass the Pay Equity Act and enforcement is in place, women will continue to lag behind on salary earnings less than men. This is not a gender issue but a family issue and a retirement issue, especially for women. Women will live longer and usually with less money when a spouse dies.

As part of the education and awareness for Pay Equity is the Wage Project. Precisely this project promotes the establishment of Wage Clubs. What are Wage Clubs? They are groups of 5-10 women who come together in a safe place where they can obtain support from other women as they share personal stories about gender discrimination at work, gather information, build allies, then go to the top to create change in their workplaces and communities.

There is a web site www.wageproject.org that provides an abundance of information on how to start and manage a Wage Club. The meetings can be separate or part of your own LO meetings. The choice is yours.

At the Legislation Day we performed a Mock Wage Club meeting during the program to give the attendees a brief participation in a meeting. I hope that LO's will start a Wage Club. Help to promote and spread the word on Pay Equity through Wage Clubs.

We learned first hand from the legislators present that they have little desire to pass the act and do not seem to understand the issue of women not being equitably paid. The fact that pay equity affects more women in poverty, families, and growth for retirement plans, seemed to not matter. We have our work cut out for us this legislative year.

The conference will once again hold regional meetings through out the state. I encourage you to attend when they are announced and take the opportunity to network at the grass roots level for the issues that affect our communities and our lives.
