She serves on the Administrative Board and is a Scripture Reader.

She is employed as a Project Manager for ANGUS DOW Chemical where she was recently recognized for completing the Master of Science in Project Management Program at George Washington University. A chemical engineer by training, she has served as mentor for several young women engineers within the Dow Chemical Company.

OPENING SESSION KEYNOTE SPEAKER—Rosa Flores, WDSU New Orleans "WORKPLACE DO'S AND DON'T'S—YOUR IMAGE AS A LEADER"

The workplace can be a minefield for any professional woman. How do you fit into your workplace, adapt to the workplace environment, work successfully with your colleagues, and navigate the leadership track?
